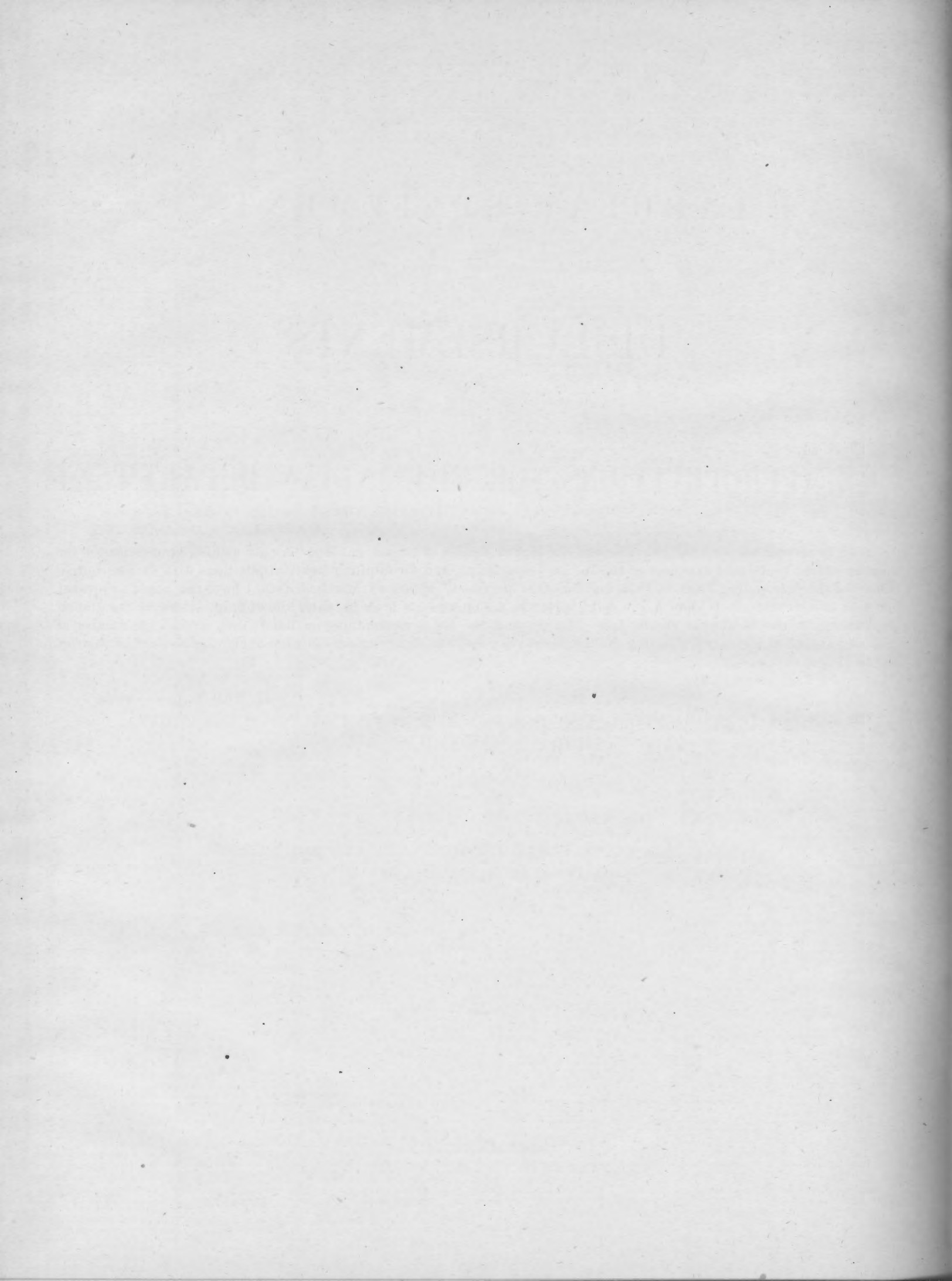

‡ A large portion of this balance will be required to meet outstanding liabilities on account of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1882; claims on account of which have not yet been settled.
