RESUBMITTING

The estimate from the Secretary of the Interior of an appropriation of \$2,000 for support and education of certain Flathead Indian pupils, which estimate was transmitted to the House by the Secretary of the Interior December 11, 1884, House Document No. 29.

January 7, 1885.—Referred to the Committee on Appropriations and ordered to be printed.

TREASURY DEPARTMENT, January 6, 1885.

SIR: In accordance with the provision in relation to submitting estimates of appropriations to Congress contained in the act of July 7, 1884 (23 Stat., 254), I have the honor to transmit herewith an estimate received from the Secretary of the Interior—

For payment, out of the unexpended balance of the appropriation for support of schools for the fiscal year 1884, to the Indian Industrial School for Boys, on the Flathead Indian Reservation, for clothing, subsisting, maintaining, and educating twenty Indian pupils in excess of the number provided for by contract with the Indian Department during the twelve months beginning July 1, 1883, and ending June 30, 1884, \$2,000.

This estimate, it will be observed, was submitted by the Interior Department to the Speaker December 11, 1884, and printed as House Ex. Doc. No. 29, and is resubmitted by this Department, at the request of the Secretary of the Interior, in order to comply with the act above referred to.
