Mr. JOHN B. RICE, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, submitted the following

R E P O R T :

[To accompany bill H. R. 447.]

*The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 447) granting a pension to M. H. Clements, submit the following report :*

The Bourbon County Guards, a military company organized in accordance with the laws of the State of Kansas, and of which Milton H. Clements was a private, was called into active service by the governor of the State of Kansas on the 3d day of September, 1874, to repel an Indian invasion. This company was in active service on the 8th day of January, 1875, at which time the said Milton H. Clements, with other members of the command, was engaged in conveying supplies to the militia near New City, Kansas, and was overtaken by a snow-storm, and was frozen so severely as to render necessary the amputation of both legs above the ankle joints. All these facts are proved by reliable evidence, and the committee, therefore, beg leave to report back the accompanying bill with the recommendation that it do pass.
