The Committee on the Judiciary, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 4915) for the relief of E. P. Smith, submit the following report:

A similar bill to this was reported from the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs, and passed the Senate April 25, 1882, without amendment. Also, a bill with the same wording was passed at the last session for the relief of General Hatch.

The Committee on the Judiciary, after investigating the facts relating to the relief of E. P. Smith and considering the evidence produced, manimously voted that the bill be reported to the House, with the recommendation that it pass.
