SUNDRY CIVIL APPROPRIATION BILL.

FEBRUARY 23, 1885:—Committed to the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union and ordered to be printed.

Mr. RANDALL, from the Committee on Appropriations, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 8256.]

In presenting to the House the bill making appropriations for the sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1886, the Committee on Appropriations herewith submit the follow-

ing report in explanation thereof:

The estimates upon which the bill is based are to be found on pages 143 to 158, 160 to 163, 177 to 190, and 198 to 216, inclusive, of the Book of Estimates for 1886, and aggregate in all, \$32,326,402.22, of which sum the committee recommend \$22,200,177.22, being a reduction of \$10,126,225 under the estimates. The appropriations for the same purposes for the current fiscal year were \$22,346,749.74, being \$146,572.52 more than is recommended in the accompanying bill for the next fiscal year.

New legislation of a general character is contained in the bill as follows:

Lines 203 to 213:

That hereafter no plan shall be prepared or approved by the Secretary of the Treasury for any public building authorized by Congress to be erected until after the site therefor shall have been purchased and paid for; and he shall not authorize or approve of any plan for any such building which shall involve a greater expenditure in the completion of such building and approaches thereto than the amount that shall remain of the sum specified in the law authorizing the erection of such building as the limit of the cost of the site and building after the site shall have been paid for.

Lines 816 to 841:

TRANSPORTATION OF SILVER COIN: That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to transport from the Treasury or subtreasuries and mints, free of charge, silver coin when requested to do so: Provided, That an equal amount in coin or currency shall have been deposited in the Treasury or such subtreasuries by the applicant or applicants. The expenses of such transportation shall be paid from the fund arising from the profits accruing from the coinage of the standard silver dollar, which is hereby appropriated for that purpose. And the Secretary of the Treasury shall annually report to Congress the cost arising under this

paragraph, so far as the same relates to the Treasury or subtreasuries.

That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized, in his discretion, to suspend, in whole or in part, from July first, eighteen hundred and eighty-five, to June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and eighty-six, inclusive, the execution of so much of the act of February twenty-eighth, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, as authorized and directs the Secretary of the Treasure and the Secretary of the Secretary of the Treasure and the Secretary of the Secretary of the Secretary izes and directs the Secretary of the Treasury to purchase, from time to time, silver bullion, to an extent not less than two million dollars' worth per month nor more than four million dollars' worth per month, and which directs the coinage of the silver bullion so purchased into standard silver dollars, and which appropriates a sufficient sum of money from the Treasury to carry out the provisions of said act in these respects.

Lines 1186 to 1188:

That hereafter in all cases of the survey of private land-claims the cost of the same shall be refunded to the Treasury by the owner before the delivery of the patent.

Lines 1417 to 1424:

That the Secretary of War is authorized and directed to sell at public auction, after due advertisement, and at prices not less than those fixed by the board of appraisers in each case, the following arsenals, namely: Allegheny Arsenal, Pennsylvania; Augusta Arsenal, Georgia; Indianapolis, Arsenal, Indiana, and Kennebec Arsenal, Maine; and the money so received, after paying the necessary expenses of sale, shall be covered into the Treasury.

Lines 2010 to 2015:

That in all contracts hereafter made for service for the House of Representatives involving the employment of horses, the expense of keeping such horses shall be covered by the contract; and no money hereafter appropriated for contingent or other expenses of the House of Representatives shall be expended for stables or forage.
