The committee having carefully considered the facts which involve the rights of the Indians on this reservation, together with the agricultural and industrial growth of the country surrounding this reservation, are unanimous in granting said right of way, as they deem this road a necessity, and therefore report the accompaying substitute for the original bill, with the recommendation that it do pass.
