REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 10559.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 10559) granting a pension to William Thompson, have considered the same and report as follows:

The records show that the claimant served in Capt. James G. Blount's company, Alabama Volunteers (Col. William Chisholm), from February 27, 1836, to May 27, 1836, a period of three months, in the Florida war. He is now seventy years of age and in poor financial condition.

This committee, during the present session, have reported a general bill for service pensions for the survivors of this and other Indian wars from 1832 to 1842.

The passage of the bill is recommended, amended, however, by striking out, in line 6, the words "Blunt's company, under General Cott," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "Blount's company, Alabama Volunteers."
