REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 11029.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 11029) granting a pension to Mary Vanbuskirk, have considered the same, and report as follows:

The claimant is the widow of John B. Vanbuskirk, who was a soldier from January 23, 1836, to January 23, 1839, in Battery G, First United States Artillery. He served in the Florida Indian war.

The widow is nearly seventy years of age, and in need of relief, as it is shown by a numerously signed petition of her neighbors and towns-

She is entitled to a service pension under the bill recently reported by this committee for the survivors and widows of survivors of the Indian wars.

Your committee recommend the passage of the bill.
