## REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 12403.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 12403) granting a pension to Bennett Cooper, have considered the same

and report as follows:

The claimant served in the Florida war, in Captain Campbell's company, from the State of Alabama, from March 1 to June 1, 1836. He was honorably discharged therefrom and received a land warrant in 1854. He is seventy-five years of age, in feeble health, and not able to work.

Your committee believe he should have a service pension, and therefore recommend the passage of the bill, amended by changing the word "Campbell's," in line 5, to "Cammel's," the latter being the correct

manner of spelling the captain's name.
