REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 12619.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 12619) granting a pension to Littleberry W. Baker, have considered the same, and report:

That the claimant served in Capt. Abram Miles's company, from the State of Georgia, in the Florida Indian war of 1836. He was honorably discharged. He is now about seventy-five years of age, in feeble health, and without income or property.

In common with other survivors of said Indian wars, your committee believe this man should have a service pension, and hence report the bill and recommend its passage, amended by changing the word "Gunn's" to "Miles's," in line 5, and "Alabama" to "Georgia," in line 6.
