REPORT:

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 11308) granting a pension to Carroll Renfro, have considered the same

and respectfully report as follows:

The records of the War Department show that the claimant was a private in Capt. John W. Otey's company, Alabama Volunteers, Creek war; enrolled May 26, 1838, and mustered out with company July 16, 1838.

J. R. Hildreth and J. W. Moore, citizens of Buena Vista, Ark., testify that the claimant is seventy years old, and by reason of age and infirmity is unable to support himself by manual labor, and he (the claimant) has no property or other means of livelihood.

The case is believed by your committee to be a meritorious one, and the bill is therefore returned with the recommendation that it do pass.
