## REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 3530.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 3530) granting a pension to Huldah Burton, have considered the same and

report as follows:

The name of claimant's late husband, Thomas Burton, appears on the rolls of Capt. Seth Pratt's company of Illinois volunteers as a musician, enrolled April 26, 1832, and being appointed drum major by Major Jacob Long, served in that capacity, with Long's "odd battalion of mounted volunteers detached for foot purposes," and was mustered out with the battalion May 28, 1832. This service was in the Black Hawk war.

The claimant asks a pension \$20 per month, declaring that she is eighty years of age, entirely without property, and dependent upon

charity for food and clothing.

In view of claimant's destitution and greatage, your committee think he relief prayed for should be granted, and the passage of the bill is commended.
