## **REPORT:**

## [To accompany bill H. R. 4202.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 4202) granting a pension to Henry S. Morgan, have considered the same and report as follows:

The claimant was a private in Captain Davis Lane's company of Georgia militia, from June 2, 1836, to July 17, 1836, and served in the Creek Indian war. He asks the same pension as is allowed by law for service in the war of 1812.

Mr. McRae, Representative in Congress from the State of Arkansas, personally knows this claimant and vouches for his old age, inability to labor, and want of sufficient support or income to afford him an adequate means of support.

Your committee believe this to be a proper case for relief by special act, and recommend the passage of the bill.
