Mr. DE LANO, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 3581.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 3581) granting a pension to John D. Prator, have considered the same and report as follows:

The claimant served as J. D. Prator in Capt. C. W. Allen's company, Colonel Thomas Beall's first regiment Georgia Mounted Volunteers, Indian War, from June 3, 1836, to July 22, 1836, and was paid for two months and twelve days' service.

He asks a pension at the same rate as is allowed by law for service in the war of 1812.

The claimant is seventy-seven years old and unable, on account of his infirmities, to earn a support at his trade as a carpenter. He has no income and is dependent upon his friends and relatives for support. These facts are vouched for by Mr. McRae, a Representative in Congress from the State of Arkansas.

In view of the facts stated herein, your committee recommend that the bill do pass.
