

THOMAS K. EDWARDS.

Mr. DE LANO, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 5905.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 5905) granting a pension to Thomas K. Edwards, have considered the same and report:

The claimant was a private in Capt. James Love's company of Georgia mounted volunteers from June 4, 1836, to August 23, 1836. This company served in the Florida Indian war.

The claimant asks a pension at the same rate as is allowed by law to the survivors of the war of 1812.

Mr. McRae, a Representative in Congress from the State of Arkansas, states that the claimant is seventy-eight years old, with no means of support, and almost helpless.

Your committee are of the opinion that this is a proper case for favorable action by Congress, and respectfully recommend the passage of the bill.
