Mr. TERRY, from the Committee on the Territories, submitted the following

**REPORT:**

[To accompany H. R. 9652.]

The Committee on the Territories, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 6920) to amend an "act providing temporary government for the Territory of Oklahoma, and enlarging the jurisdiction of the United States court in the Indian Territory, and for other purposes," approved May 2, 1890, having had the same under consideration, beg leave to report a substitute therefor, which is herewith submitted:

The particular object of the proposed legislation is to reduce the cost of administration of justice in the Indian Territory, and relieve the overcrowded dockets of the Federal courts therein, by enlarging the jurisdiction of the commissioner courts in civil and misdemeanor cases.

Your committee therefore report the substitute and recommend its adoption and passage through the House.
