REPORT :

[To accompany bill S. 134.]

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to which was referred the petition of Henry Catlin, senior partner of the late firm of Catlin, Peoples, & Co., report :

That this is a claim for spoliation of goods, &c., by the Creek Indians, in 1836; and, unlike most claims presented to Congress, is well drawn up and clearly proved. It was disallowed at the Executive department, because it was an act of *quasi* war on the part of the Creeks, and the petitioner is referred to Congress.

The committee report a bill for the amount of the loss, being \$1,612 72.
