PREAMBLE AND RESOLUTIONS in relation to losses from depredations of Indians.

Whereas numbers of our citizens suffered great losses from depredations of the Indians in the late Seminole war, for which we consider the General Assembly responsible, and for which no compensation has been made: therefore

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State
of Florida in General Assembly convened, That our Senators and Representative in Congress be, and they are hereby, requested to use their best
endeavors, at as early a period as possible, to bring this matter before Congress, and to procure an appropriation for the remuneration and indemnity
of the said sufferers.
