## SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR,

 IN ANSWERTo a Senate resolution of March 6, 1876, accompanying information in relation to the expenditures of the Indian Bureau and the number of Indians provided for at the expense of the Government.

May 3, 1876.-Referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs and ordered to be printed.

SIR : I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of a resolution of the Senate under date of March 6, in the following words:
"Resolved, That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, directed to furnish for the information of the Senate, if not incompatible with the public interest, a sta tement showing the annual expenditures of the Indian Bureau since its organization to the present time; and also the number of Indians provided for at the expense of the Government each year since the organization of said Indian Bureau."

In reply I have the honor respectfully to invite your attention to the inclosed copy of report, dated 1st instant, from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, together with the accompanying schedule, therein referred to.

SIR: In response to a resolution of the Senate under date of March 6,1876 , referred by you to this Office for report thereon, I have the honor to transmit herewith a tabular statement showing the number of Indians provided for at the expense of the Government in each year, together with the annual expenditures of the Indian Bureau since its organization.

In forwarding this statement, however, I desire to state distinctly that I have encountered great difficulties in the preparation of the
figures showing the number of Indians provided for by the Government, particularly in the earlier years named; for, until within a few years, owing to objections thereto by the Indians, no accurate census was possible, and the estimates were, prior to 1865, based upon unsatisfactory data. I submit these figures, therefore, as estimates only. I believe them to be entitled to that weight (and that alone) which is due to a careful and somewhat laborious attempt to collect, complete, and collate statistics from reports which are always fragmentary and often confused. In the absence of any previous attempt of this character, such an estimate may have some value: In that belief it is submitted.

In the compilation of the table of population, tribes for whom an appropriation was made in any one year are included, no matter whether such appropriation was large enough for the purchase of a few trinkets as presents onl 5 , or for actual and continuous support during

* the entire jear. Exception to this rule was made, however, in the cases of the Cherokees, Choctaws, Chickasa ws, Creeks, and the Six Nations of New York, aggregating, as per las t anuual report, 52,217, for which tribes the annual appropriations have been mainly for interest on their own funds or in pursuance of old treaty stipulations. But, although the population of the above-named tribes is excluded from the estimate of Indian population as given in the table, all expenditures on their behalf are included in the total annual expenditures, which cover all disbursements by the Treasury for the Indian service.

The resolution of the Senate is herewith returned.
