

RESOLUTION
OF
THE LEGISLATURE OF KANSAS,
IN FAVOR OF

The passage of such laws as will secure to bona-fide settlers upon the Cherokee neutral lands the full benefit of the homestead and pre-emption laws, and also to secure to the State the 16th and 36th sections of land in each township, for school purposes.

JANUARY 30, 1872.—Ordered to lie on the table and be printed.

Be it resolved by the house of representatives, (the senate concurring herein,) That the Congress of the United States is earnestly requested to pass such laws as may secure to bona-fide settlers upon the Cherokee neutral land the full benefit of the homestead and pre-emption laws, and also secure to the State the 16th and 36th sections of land in each township throughout these lands, for school purposes.

SEC. 2. That our Representatives and Senators in Congress are urged to use their best efforts to secure such legislation as will accomplish the above object.

SEC. 3. That the secretary of state is hereby instructed to transmit a copy of the above resolution to each member of the Kansas congressional delegation.
