

RESOLUTION
OF CONDOLENCE OF
THE LEGISLATURE OF TEXAS,

IN RELATION TO

The massacre of General G. A. Custer and his men.

AUGUST 7, 1876.—Ordered to lie on the table and be printed.

Whereas General G. A. Custer has endeared himself to the people of the frontier of Texas and elsewhere by his bold and dashing operations against the Indians; and whereas the news of his late sudden death, while in discharge of his dangerous duties, is received: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the legislature of the State of Texas, That we tender our sincere condolence to the family of the deceased and to the people of our suffering frontier; and that the governor be requested to forward a copy of this joint resolution to our Senators and members of Congress, with the request that the same be spread upon the journals of Congress and a copy of the same be forwarded to the family of the deceased.
