MEMORIAL

OF

THE LEGISLATURE OF MINNESOTA,

IN FAVOR OF

The establishment of a mail route from Chippewa Agency, Minnesota, to Superior City, Wisconsin.

DEBUARY 25, 1864.—Referred to the Committee on Post Offices and Post Roads and ordered to be printed.

To the honorable the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States in Congress assembled:

The legislature of the State of Minnesota respectfully represents :

That the settlers in the vicinity of Lake Superior, Mille Lac, Crow Wing, and Chippewa Agency, have opened and are improving a direct line of road through the above localities; that the commercial interests connected with Lake Superior demand an increase of mail facilities; and that the establishment of a reckly mail route from Chippewa Agency to Lake Superior would form one of the most important mail routes in the State, thereby opening a complete line of immunication from Lake Superior to the British possessions of the north.

Your memorialists, therefore, ask of Congress the establishment of the mail route herein described.

And your memorialists will ever pray.
