If the resolution requires copies of all accounts current, abstracts, vouchers, and returns rendered by late Agent Clapp, the work will be a heavy draft upon this office in the existing condition of its clerical force, for it will involve the copying of nearly one thousand papers, many of which are large sheets and closely written.

It is proper to state that the property account of late Agent Clapp is closed, and also that he has filed full and voluminous explanations, which he claims will remedy the defects in the vouchers first rendered, and that said explanations have not yet been passed into settlement, but that they are now in the office of the Second Comptroller for examination.
