Mr. DAVIS, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany H. R. 6279.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 6279) granting a pension to Henry J. Alvis, have considered the same and report:

The claimant rendered service in Capt. W. H. Mark's company, Louisiana Volunteers, Florida Indian war, and the same has been officially recognized by the allowance to him of bounty land.

In his petition for relief the claimant swears he is 81 years old, the owner of no real estate and with no personal property of over \$200 in value; also that by reason of age and infirmity he can do no labor by which to support himself.

The claimant's reputation for truth and veracity is fully vouched for by the sworn statements of neighbors and acquaintances of many years' standing.

The passage of the bill is respectfully recommended.
