Mr. STOCKBRIDGE, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany S. 688, 1090, and 2929.]

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred the bill (S. 688) to amend sections 1 and 2 of an act entitled "An act to authorize the sale of timber on certain lands reserved for the use of the Menomonee tribe of Indians, in the State of Wisconsin," and the bill (S. 1090) to amend section 1 and section 2 of an act entitled "An act to authorize the sale of timber on certain lands reserved for the use of the Menomonee tribe of Indians, in the State of Wisconsin," have had the same under consideration and respectfully report:

These two bills relate to the same subject and propose substantially the same changes.

Your committee recommend the adoption of the accompanying substitute for the first-named (S. 688), and that the second (S. 1090) be thereupon indefinitely postponed.
