Mr. Manderson, from the Committee on Printing, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany Senate resolution authorizing the printing of 3,000 extra copies of Executive Document No. 31, Fifty-second Congress, first session, being a report made by the Hampton Institute regarding its returned Indian students.]

The Committee on Printing to whom was referred the above Senate resolution, having had the same under consideration, report it back with an amendment, to wit: In lieu of "three thousand" substitute "fifteen hundred," and as thus amended recommend its passage.

The reason for this proposed amendment is that the cost of printing 3,000 copies will be \$828, which exceeds the \$500 limitation, and to bring it within that limitation, the number proposed to be printed is cut down one-half. The cost of 1,500 extra copies will be \$414.
