The claimant's late husband, Osborne Lockett, was a private in Captain George River's company of Alabama Volunteers, and served from May 15 to June 7, 1836, in the Florida Indian war. He was paid for twenty-four days' service.

The evidence filed in support of the bill shows that the claimant is of good character, about fifty-four years old, in needy circumstances, with no income, and largely dependent upon relatives for support.

In view of the facts stated your committee recommend the passage of the bill.

The bill is reported favorably with a recommendation that it do pass,
