The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 9332) granting a pension to Joseph J. Granberry, have considered the same and report:

The records of the War Department show that the claimant was enrolled June 20, 1836, in the Stewart County Rangers, Georgia Volunteers, Creek war, and was mustered out with the company September 8, 1836.

It is reliably shown by the proof submitted that the claimant is 77 years old, in infirm health, and without means, being dependent upon his own exertion for support.

Your committee believe the bill to be a meritorious one, and the same is therefore returned with a favorable recommendation.
