The following By-Law Changes will be presented during the Annual Meeting in October. Proposed changes are underlined and italicized:

#### **Proposed By-Law Changes**

ARTICLE I. PURPOSES (2) To help identify Oklahoma Cooperative Extension-Family and Consumer Sciences programs and projects needed by Oklahoma families

#### Proposed amendment:

Article I, Purposes (2) To help identify <u>and fund</u> Oklahoma Cooperative Extension-Family and Consumer Sciences programs and projects needed by Oklahoma families

Rationale: Clarifies the purpose of CE-FCS Ambassadors

## ARTICLE II. ANNUAL AND LIFETIME AMBASSADORS

Section B. Initial contributions are payable with a pledge. Future annual contributions are payable on January 1. Checks should be made payable to OSU Foundation/ CE-FCS Ambassadors (CE-FCS refers to Oklahoma Family and Consumer Sciences Cooperative Extension) and submitted to the Assistant Director, Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service, Family and Consumer Sciences Programs, 104 Human Environmental Sciences, Stillwater, OK 74078-6111 for deposit in the OSU Foundation. The Board of Directors will determine expenditure of the funds and management will be by the OSU Foundation.

#### Proposed amendment:

#### ARTICLE II. ANNUAL AND LIFETIME AMBAS-SADORS

Section B. Initial contributions are payable with a pledge. Future annual contributions are payable on January 1. Checks should be made payable to OSU Foundation/ CE-FCS Ambassadors (CE-FCS refers to Oklahoma Family and Consumer Sciences Cooperative Extension) and submitted to the Assistant Director, Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service, Family and Consumer Sciences Programs, for deposit in the OSU Foundation. The Board of Directors will determine expenditure of the funds and management will be by the OSU Foundation.

Rationale: Eliminates the need to update bylaws to coincide with address changes.

#### ARTICLE III. Officers and Directors

<u>Section F.</u> The secretary will keep a permanent record of the proceedings of the CE-FCS Ambassadors, minutes of the Board of Directors meetings, and names and addresses of annual and lifetime Ambassadors.

ARTICLE III. Officers and Directors

<u>Section F.</u> The secretary will keep a permanent record of the proceedings of the CE-FCS Ambassadors, minutes of the Board of Directors meetings, and names and addresses of annual, *charter* and lifetime Ambassadors.

Rational: Fulfills need to update charter member mailing list.

#### ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

<u>Section A.</u> The standing committees of the Ambassadors will be: program of work, project, nominating, finance, public relations and recruitment, newsletters, bylaws and *historian*.

#### Proposed amendment:

ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

<u>Section A.</u> The standing committees of the Ambassadors will be: program of work, project, nominating, finance, public relations and recruitment, newsletters, bylaws and <u>archives</u>.

Rationale: Establishes a name for the committee the historian will chair.

ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

<u>Section B.</u> Committee chair and members will be appointed by the president with approval of the Board for a two-year term. Their term will coincide with that of the president. No person

will serve more than two consecutive terms on

the same committee.

#### Proposed amendment:

ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

<u>Section B.</u> Committee chair and members will be appointed by the president with approval of the Board for a two-year term. Their term will coincide with that of the president. No person, <u>with the exception of the historian</u>, will serve more than two consecutive terms on the same committee.

Rationale: Allowing the historian to serve consecutive terms will provide continuity.

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#### ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

<u>Section I.</u> The memoirs of the Ambassadors will be coordinated by a Historian, appointed by the President for a two-year term. The Historian will work with a committee of Ambassadors as needed to secure the history of the organization.

<u>Section I.</u> The memoirs of the Ambassadors will be coordinated by a Historian, appointed by the President for a two-year term. The Historian will work with <u>the Archives</u> committee <u>comprised of three</u> Ambassadors as needed to secure the history of the organization.

Rationale: Clarifies name and size of committee.
