

Insect Update

Several reports of stinkbug infestations have come in the past week. Control measures were initiated in some fields, and in others a "wait and see" approach was used. When pondering an insecticide application, beneficial arthropod population disruption should be considered. The beneficials so far have being doing a great job of cleaning up aphid populations. A disruption this late may not allow beneficials to build back in sufficient numbers to arrest an aphid infestation before open bolls occur. Sticky cotton is a major concern for the industry and all precautions should be used. The threshold for cotton aphids is to treat when 50% of the plant terminals are infested and aphids exceed 50 per leaf. With the current low cotton price this number could be 80 per leaf. Hopefully the beneficials will take care of the problem. If aphid populations are present as bolls begin to open, there is zero tolerance in order to reduce the potential for the honeydew contamination of the lint. Grasshoppers are still present. Moth counts continue to be below the long-term average.
















Beet armyworm moth
