What is ENDA?

The Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA) seeks to extend fair employment practices under federal law to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community. It does not create any "special rights," but simply affords to all Americans basic protection from employment discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity. It is based on the principle that every worker should be judged solely on his or her merits. ENDA applies the same procedures and similar, but more limited, remedies as other federal civil rights laws, like Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

A Pragmatic Approach

ENDA is a pragmatic and measured solution to the problem of work-place discrimination against gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender Americans. It does not apply to small businesses, most religious organizations, or the military. It prohibits preferential treatment, the


use of quotas, and the collection of statistics. It permits employers to maintain generallyapplicable workplace policies, including dress codes. ENDA does not require that benefits be provided to the same-sex partners of employees.

Public Support

ENDA's goal is widely supported by the American people. According to a 2006 Gallup study, 89% of Americans believe gay people should have equal job opportunities. In a 2004 Hart Research poll, 65% of those surveyed believe it should definitely be illegal to fire someone because he or she is transgender. ENDA is also supported by large coalition of civil rights, labor, and religious organizations, including the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights.

States' Experience

Seventeen states (California, Connecticut, Hawaii, Illinois, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Rhode Island, Vermont, Washington, Wisconsin) and the District of Columbia have passed laws prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation. In addition, eight states (California, Illinois, Maine, Minnesota, New Jersey, New Mexico, Rhode Island, Washington) and the District of Columbia prohibit discrimination based on gender identity. Most of these laws are broader in scope than ENDA, covering discrimination not only in employment, but also in housing and public accommodations.

health note: lesbians more likely to be overweight

Researchers compared population estimates of overweight and obesity across sexual orientation groups using data from the 2002 National Survey of Family Growth. The study sample of almost 6,000 women found that lesbians were more likely to be overweight and obese, putting themselves at higher risk for conditions such as diabetes and heart disease. The study's authors said their findings point to "an urgent need for weightreduction interventions that target the high-risk group of sexualminority women." help stop child sex tourism

For a long time, ECPAT has been engaging the travel and tourism industry in efforts to end the abhorrent practice of child sex tourism—traveling away from your home country or region to sexually exploit children. While the legitimate travel industry is not promoting child sex tourism, their facilities are used by sex tourists to get to destinations where they can find vulnerable children. This puts the industry in a position to help combat child sex tourism.

For that reason ECPAT-Sweden developed a *Code of Conduct for the Protection of Children from Sexual Exploitation in Travel and Tourism* (www.thecode.org). More than 500 companies around the world have signed the *Code of Conduct*. In the U.S., one large travel company has signed the *Code of Conduct* as have several small companies and one travel industry trade association.

ECPAT estimates that 25% of the sex tourists abusing children around the world are Americans. But few U.S. companies have signed the Code of Conduct. We need to let these companies hear from all Americans that this is not acceptable. Everyone has a role to play. There are three things you can do:

- 1) Send letters to the four large US hotel companies asking them to sign the Code of Conduct. Attached are copies of four letters that we ask you to sign and send to the CEOs of these large companies. If you prefer to have ECPAT-USA send these letters for you, just respond to this email with your name and address and we will send these letters on your behalf.
- 2) Patronize Code of Conduct companies when you travel, for leisure or business. You might also want to let them know that the reason you are patronizing them is because they have signed the Code of Conduct. - 3) Encourage the company you work for to get involved. If you work for a company that has an in-house travel department, ask them to adopt an ethical policy on child sex tourism, such as the one in the *Code of*
