Endowment Plan For Library

The library committee repeatedly receives requests for new books and journals which can not be purchased under the present budget. If the budget were increased in proportion to the demand it would soon reach an amount impossible to maintain from annual dues. No matter how small the yearly increase may be the saturation point would be eventually reached.

The establishment of an effective endowment fund is slow but certain and there is the factor of permanence. Furthermore by employing the endowment plan the library would steadily increase each year without increasing the annual appropriation after the first year. This is how that works.

During 1937 the library subscribed to 33 journals ranging from \$1.00 to \$13.00 averaging \$7.41 per journal. \$200.00 at 4% (government insured) provides \$8.00 per year or a little over the cost of one journal. \$200.00 placed in the endowment fund each year for 33 years would place the subscriptions to the present list of journals (or the equivalent) on a permanent endowment basis. Thereafter \$8.00 per year would be available for journals, books or binding without increasing the original annual appropriation of \$200.00. Any increase in this appropriation would of course increase proportionately the income from endowment as long as the interest remained the same.

Requests for increase in the library appropriation for 1938 have been made estimating that \$1000.00 should be used for this purpose.

No matter how important the library may be the finance committee should very seriously consider maintaining the library budget at the present level of approximately \$500.00 and add only \$200.00 or \$250.00 at most for endowment which would yield \$8.00 to \$10.00 in 1939 or in other words increase the library by one journal.

One journal a year is slow but steady. In 1932 the library had 45 journals which was found to be too great a load. This year it has 33. If the endowment plan had started in 1932 at \$200.00 per year, five journals would be on a permanent endowment basis at this time.

The annual statement report of the Endowment Funds in this issue shows slow but steady increase. The money deposited in these funds has come from donations from members and friends of the society, interest from general funds and Bulletin advertisements. Not one cent from dues.

Use of the Rear Entrance to The Medical Arts Building

Complaints have been made regarding discourteous treatment to physicians and their patients using the rear entrance to the Medical Arts Building from attendants of the Medical Arts Parking Lot. The impression has been given that this entrance is for the sole use of those who pay for parking in the rear of the building and some physicians have avoided sending patients to this entrance which is far more convenient for a person on crutches than the front entrance especially on wet days and when cars are double parked.

The building management has requested that the occupants of the building be informed through this bulletin that the rear entrance is for the convenience of the occupants of the building and their patients at all times. Any person escorting a patient to the building is entitled to stop long enough to help that person in and any occupant bringing his professional equipment or belongings to the building may of course stop long enough to unload. Those leaving their cars on the lot are of course expected to pay the regular charges for parking.

You are requested to report directly to the building office any discourtesies encountered by yourself or your patients.

The Secretary's statement regarding equal representation on the Board of Trustees at the annual meeting was misunderstood.

The statement was made because of much talk of politics. The Secretary was asked by members of the staff of each hospital what candidates the other staff was putting up. Much concern was expressed about the Board of Trustees. Since the amendment suggested by the secretary made the representation uneven the secretary requested before the meeting that one member be added to even things up expecting the society to re-elect the 1937 president to the Board. When the society voted to retain the present board of seven members the secretary merely asked that that question of equal representation be settled once and for all. No formal resolutions were made but by the acceptance of statements made from the floor it was unanimously agreed that hospital staff membership will play no part in the election to Medical Society offices.

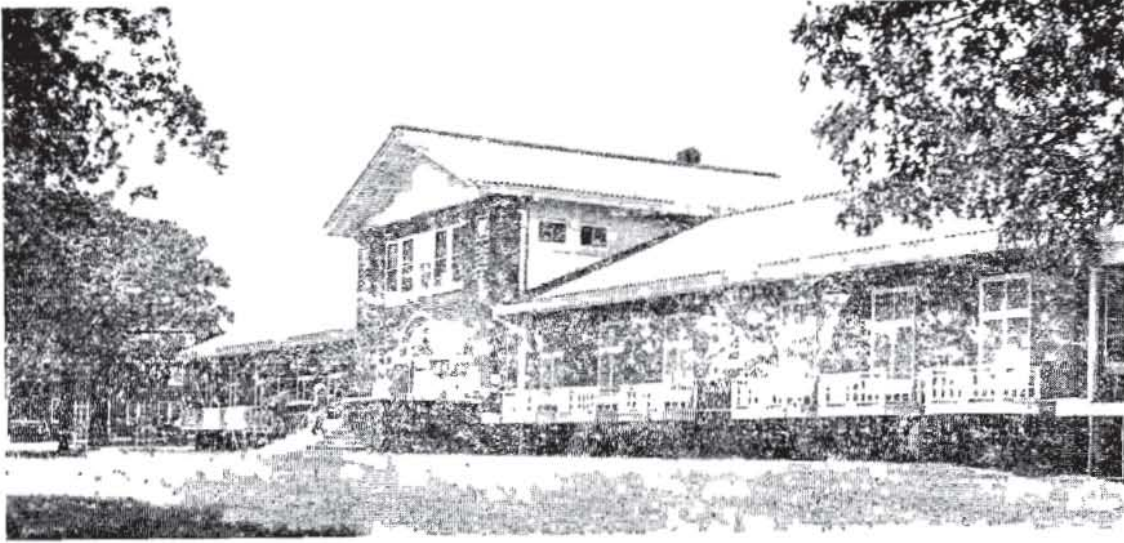
