Society Progress Observed

A Review of Activities of the Tulsa County Medical Society for the First Half of 1942 Indicates a High Degree of Member Cooperation and Leadership. Financial Condition Is Sound.

Reviewing its record of activities for the first six months of 1942, the Tulsa County Medical Society has operated in an efficient and effective manner to bring many benefits to its 200 members.

With practically all committees cooperating wholeheartedly with officers and trustees, the Society numbered many accomplishments during the first half of the year, including the following:

The long-standing difficulties between the Society and the Board of County Commissioners over operation of the County Clinic was successfully settled by arbitration. An agreement negotiated by the Clinic Committee, and signed March 23, embodied most of the principles which the Society had maintained throughout the dispute. Machinery for arbitration of future disputes by the Tulsa Council of Social Agencies was set up, and the basis for future operation of the clinic was clearly outlined. Credit for this accomplishment goes to Dr. Ralph A. McGill, Dr. P. P. Nesbitt, and Dr. James D. Markland.

The Medical Credit Bureau, adopting new policies of management, paid off a large indebtedness and by June was turning an operating profit to the Tulsa County Medical Society. The Bureau attained a reputation for its prompt attention to delinquent accounts, for its policy of quick remission of col-

lections. In one month, April, the Bureau broke all-time collection records, turned more than \$1,200 to doctors. Accounts are being collected on a cost basis, with fees as low as 20 per cent. Salaries of Bureau workers were twice raised in the period. Dr. Paul Grosshart is chairman of the Medical Credit Bureau Committee.

Most outstanding progress was reported by the Tulsa County Medical Library. Circulation of books and journals were more than five times the circulation of a similar period last year, with personal visits to the library doubling in number. Telephone service was greatly increased as the library provided a growing number of books and journals to doctors. Commendable is the personal service afforded by the competent librarian. Through the assistance of the Ladies Auxiliary and other donors, many new furnishings were added to make the library very comfortable and attractive. A new floor covering, new chairs, desks, lamps, and curtains have been provided. Another noteworthy trend was the increasing number of gifts to the library, both in the form of books and periodicals and in cash endowments. Praises for their supervision go to the Library Committee members, Dr. M. D. Spottswood, Dr. David Hudson, and Dr. John G. Matt.

The Bulletin underwent a number of changes, the most important of which was a personalizing effort. Medical articles printed in the Bulletin for the most part interpreted the subject from the point of view of Tulsa doctors. Advertising, despite a nation-wide slump, continued steady with the Bulletin providing a steady source of income. Dr. B. W. Ward and his Bulletin Committee contributed many valuable suggestions to the editors.

The Legislative Committee, really active for the first time in many years, cooperated with the state committee in determining the relative merits of candidates, in presenting their views on medical questions to members, and in providing information of a legislative nature. Credit for this achievement goes to the Legislative Committee, Dr. R. C. Pigford, Dr. George Osborn, and Dr. R. M. Shepard.

Dr. Hugh Graham's Constitution and By-Laws Committee weeded out several confusing paragraphs in the constitution and by-laws, secured the passage of simplified and effective substitutes that tightened the structure of Society organization.

Notable was the highly active Insurance Committee in several important insurance projects affecting Society welfare. These projects included the cooperative transfer of the master malpractice policy to the Oklahoma State Medical Association, thereby greatly enlarging the scope of the policy and pointing the way toward future reductions in premium rates. Another service was the Committee's efforts to secure pro-rata refunds on policies of members entering service. Still another service was the committee's strong cooperation in fighting malpractice suits filed against Tulsa physicians. The committee further performed a service by passing on all malpractice applications, thereby limiting the chance of suit through careful selection of clients. Dr. V. K. Allen, Dr. J. S. Chalmers, and Dr. J. D. Shipp are to be complimented for their effort.

Hardest job was the special five-man

committee duties of the Military Service Committee, which acted as liaison agent between the Society and the Procurement and Assignment Service. In a highly impartial matter, the Military Service group worked many hours in guaranteeing the most effective and impartial operation of the Procurement & Assignment Service and its draft on medical services for duty with the armed forces. These committee members include Dr. James Miner, Dr. J. F. Gorrell, Dr. W. Albert Cook, Dr. C. C. Hoke, and Dr. Henry Browne.

The attractive scientific programs of the Program Committee kept attendance at Spring meetings at a high level. Dr. H. A. Ruprecht, Dr. G. H. Henry, and Dr. Eugene Wolff displayed a sincere interest in their tasks.

Not to be forgotten is the excellent record of the State Convention Committee, which worked many long hours to perfect the details of the state medical convention here last April 22-25. The result was a most commendable meeting that disheartening war news stimulated, rather than discouraged. Particular congratulations to committee chairmen Dr. John E. McDonald, Dr. R. C. Pigford, Dr. E. Rankin Denny, and Dr. W. A. Showman.

Dr. A. Ray Wiley's Civic Relations Committee functioned in cooperation with the Chamber of Commerce's Public Health Committee to provide a fine program of work in improving local public health. Instrumental in creating the program were Dr. Hugh Graham, Dr. Ned R. Smith, Dr. A. W. Pigford, and Dr. W. A. Dean.

The Executive Office, under direct supervision of officers and trustees, provided efficient service to the doctors by administration of all committees and general Society affairs. At the end of June, the Tulsa County Medical Society was in the best financial condition in its history, boasted a bank balance nearly ten times the balance of a year ago.

The Tulsa County Medical Society is frequently requested to provide the name of "a good doctor." These requests usually come from persons who are new arrivals in Tulsa, quite often defense workers.

In an effort to be as impartial as possible, the Society has a system which is employed in all such cases. When a request of this nature is received, the Executive Secretary provides the names of two doctors who are general practitioners and two who are professed specialists. These names are taken from prepared lists of general practitioners and specialists, and are rotated accordingly.

Of course, the lists are complete and include the names of all members of the county Society. This system is operated by the Executive Office under the supervision of the Secretary-Treasurer.

In this manner an extremely fair method of recommendation is in operation. Inquirants are provided with more than one doctor to choose from. Naturally, the Executive Office does not make any recommendation or comment on the professional ability of any of its members.

News And Notes

All doctors who hold prepaid malpractice policies with the London & Lancashire Company may receive a pro-rata refund of the premium upon entering the armed service. Application should be made to the agent from whom purchased.

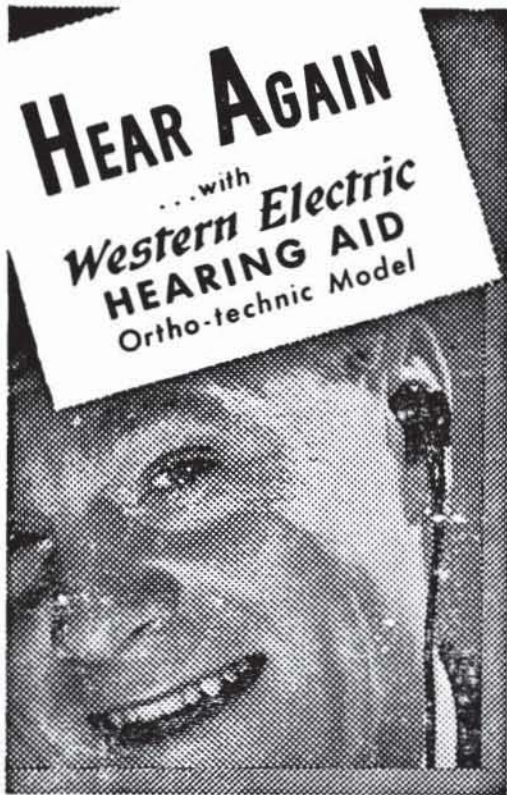
A discontinuation of Group Hospital Service may be requested by members entering the service, although doctors are urged to retain their policies for protection of members of the family.

Members who have not paid their second-half dues at this time are considered as suspended without action, and not in good standing. They will not be certified to military examiners as members in good standing until payment is made.
