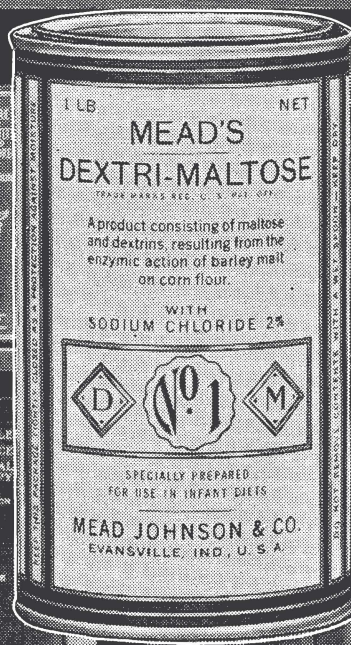

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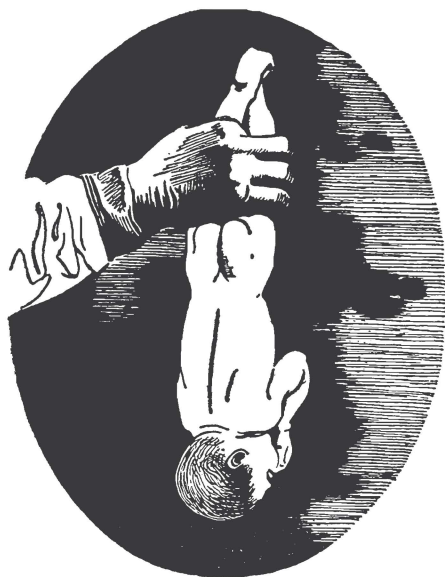

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FROM THIS DAY ON . . .

TULSA MEDICAL POPULATION GROWING

Tulsa County Medical Society Records Increase of Ten Doctors in Last Year. Influx of Specialists Continues as Office Space Situation Alleviates Slightly.

Tulsa County's medical doctor population has shown a slight increase of ten physicians in the last year, an analysis of membership rolls of the Tulsa County Medical Society indicates. As of July 15, 1948, the Society recorded 220 active members and five applicants, a total of 225 as against a comparative figure of 215 for the same date in 1947.

During the past twelve months the Society admitted fifteen new members, an increase of three over a similar period last year. This increase was offset by several deaths, one retirement, and the balance representing physicians who removed their practice to other areas. Of those physicians leaving Tulsa, all were newer members admitted since the close of the war.

On the basis of 225 members, the Society continues to reflect a ratio of about one physician to each 1,000 persons of population in Tulsa County. This figure is coincident with a desirable minimum ratio prescribed for the average community by the American Medical Association. However, in actual practice the ratio must be adjusted by consideration of the fact that some 25 physicians (including eleven colored doctors) are not members of the Tulsa County Medical Society. Further adjustment is made in that Tulsa's concentration of medical specialties serves a large number of patients drawn from a dozen counties in Northeastern Oklahoma and Western Arkansas.

The trend towards specialization continues. Of the fifteen new members, and

the three applicants yet to be acted upon by the Society, only three are general practitioners. Surgery and Internal Medicine continue to be the most popular fields of specialty with new members of the Society. Some 65 per cent of Tulsa doctors are now practicing as specialists.

The office space situation has become considerably alleviated in the past year. Where offices were virtually non-existent in 1946, and hard to get in 1947, most newcomers in Tulsa experience little delay at this time. Only three downtown buildings—the Medical & Dental Arts Buildin, the Braniff Building, and the Court Arcade Building—are reported to be interested in doctor-tenants, but each of the three have admitted new doctors in the past twelve months. The Executive Offices continue to receive a large number of offers by property owners to convert apartment houses and store buildings to the use of physicians in group or clinic practice. The majority of these prospects are valueless as landlords seek excessive rentals, long-term leases, requirements that the tenant remodel, etc. Most such structures are entirely unsuitable without extensive remodeling. Others are in areas which offer no parking facilities or which cannot be zoned for business. These offers are business moves to defeat OPA restrictions existing on residential properties.

During the past year very few physicians have located in residential or suburban areas. Most doctors inquiring at the Executive Office for office space prefer downtown locations.

BLOOD DONOR CENTER SEEKING MEDICAL DIRECTOR

Plans for a Fall opening of the Tulsa Red Cross-Tulsa County Medical Society Blood Donor Center were near completion last month as the unit sought a salaried medical director from among Tulsa's medical personnel. The position will be part-time, requiring the services of a medical doctor approximately three to four hours each afternoon Monday through Friday. Members of the Tulsa County Medical Society interested in the position may file an application at the Executive Offices. The salary has not been fixed, and will depend in part upon the qualifications and experience of the applicant.

Dr. Felix R. Park, Chairman of the Blood Bank Committee, said that the medical director must have considerable interest and enthusiasm for the project, pointing out that much of the success of the entire proposal would depend upon the manner in which it was prosecuted during the first year of operation. The medical director will be permitted to engage in a private practice during his off-hours, but attendance at the Center during

1878-1948

Dr. Mortimer A. Houser, 70, veteran Tulsa County physician and surgeon, died June 20, 1948, after a brief illness. He had practiced in Tulsa since 1904, most recently in the McBirney Building and during the past year at his residence at 1427 South Main. Born in 1878, Dr. Houser received his medical degree from Milwaukee Medical College in 1903. After several months practice at Pawhuska, he came to Tulsa in 1904 and rapidly established himself as a leader in the fields of medicine and surgery. Dr. Houser was active in hospital affairs and was a former Chief of Staff at Hillcrest Memorial Hospital. Funeral services were conducted June 22, 1948. The widow, Mrs. Jennie Houser, survives.

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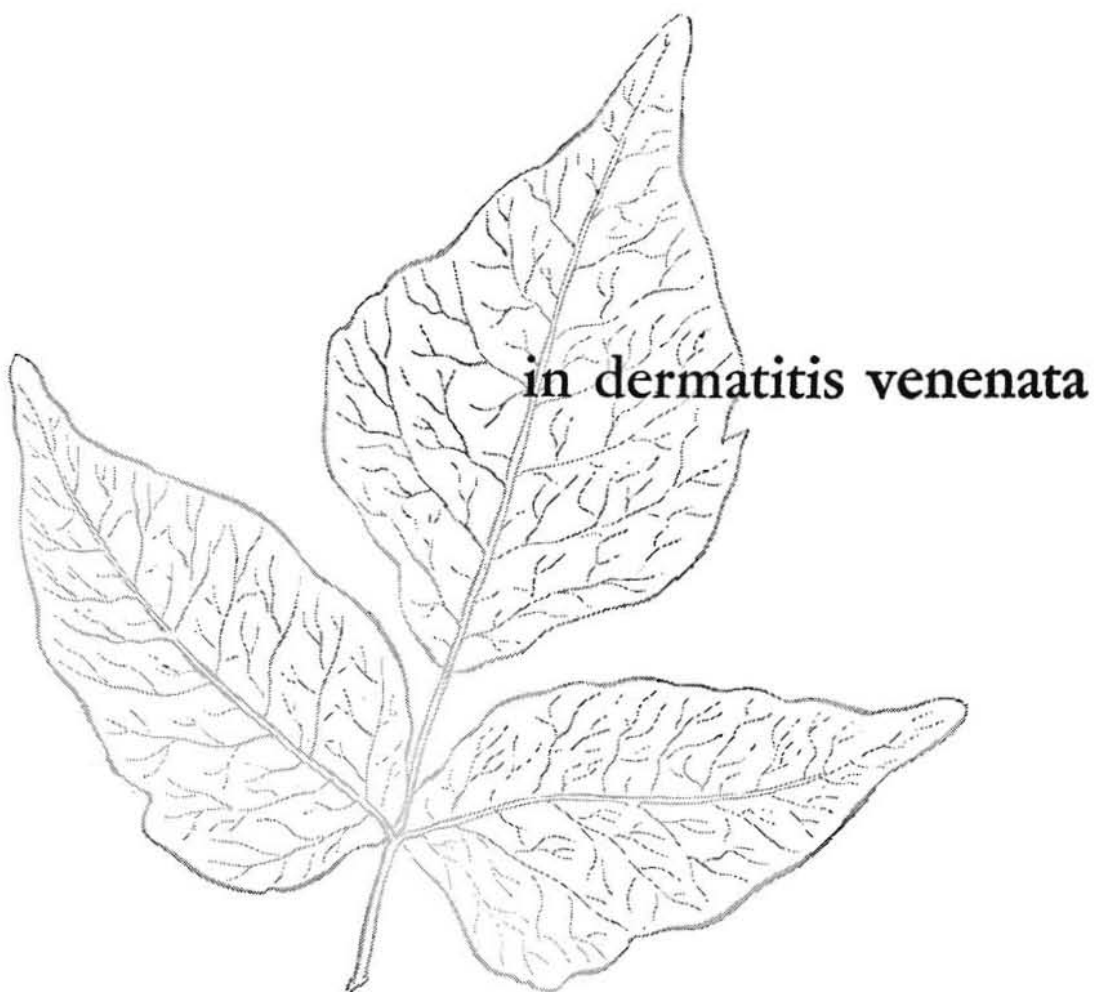

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AMA CONVENTION NOTES

The American Medical Association's 97th Annual Meeting in Chicago last June 20-24 ran true to form—a sprawling, often gaudy convention attended by physicians from every part of the world. Over 30,000 doctors, exhibitors, and guests registered to give the AMA its largest post-war attendance . . . the conservative House of Delegates, testy at repeated jibes at its senility, gave more ground to a younger and liberal element which will probably control the Association within two or three years . . . chief topics of conversation in the House of Delegates were Dr. Paul R. Hawley's straight talk on the need for coordination in non-profit prepayment hospital and medical care plans, the Navy's Surgeon General Rear Admiral Swanson's executive session comments that American Medicine must provide by voluntary enlistment sufficient doctors to man the new Selective Service program . . . scientific sections were again

first-rate in every respect, the list of speakers representing a regular Who's Who in American Medicine . . . on-the-spot televised surgical operations were well received with the E. R. Squibb Company footing the bill. Most of the visitors had never seen television, all agreeing it had immense teaching possibilities for medical schools . . . the Navy Pier was jammed with hundreds of scientific and commercial exhibits that took at least a full day to properly visit. The exhibits were an education in themselves, ranging from displays of latest methods of therapy and surgical technique to artistic efforts of American doctors. Many a Tulsa physician returned weary and footsore from the long hike around the pier . . . The Oklahoma State Medical Association maintained headquarters at the Palmer House where AMA delegates Dr. James Stevenson and Dr. C. R. Roundtree personally entertained delegates with a de-

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lightful buffet supper. Much in evidence also were Dick Graham, the State Association's genial Executive Secretary, and his new assistant, John Hart. Also Dr. C. E. Northcutt, the Association's new President, of Ponca City, and his predecessor, Dr. Paul B. Champlin of Enid . . . Tulsa's Dr. James Stevenson as AMA delegate is gaining a host of friends in the House of Delegates for his liberal views and sincere interest in the progress of American Medicine . . . The Executive Secretaries were in force, a rapidly growing group of young men and women, all anxious for pointers to better their county and state societies. They are treated with extreme courtesy and kindness by the AMA and made to feel a part of the scheme of organized medicine . . . The Council of County Medical Society Officers, held June 19, produced little of value to Tulsa County Medical Society officers. Most of the projects and ideas discussed were ancient history to this organization, but we were not too far advanced to be taught a few things. The Society's President Victor K. Allen spoke briefly on the organization of scientific programs, did an excellent job . . . Tulsa doctors enjoyed themselves at Chicago's leading restaurants, hotel dinner rooms, and theaters. The Palmer House's Hildegard was a favorite, likewise the Mack Sennett ballet in "High Button Shoes" . . . Dr. John G. Matt, Secretary of the Tulsa County Medical Society, and now on leave for several months postgraduate study in the East, was a welcome sight . . . Seen here and there: Dr. H. B. Stewart, discussant of a scientific paper on anesthesiology . . . Dr. H. A. Ruprecht and Dr. R. C. Pigford in an unsuccessful attempt to get a table at Don The Beachcomber's . . . Dr. J. K. 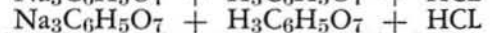
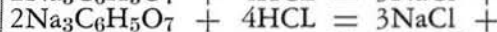
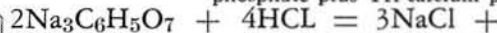
REACTION WITH HCl OF GASTRIC CONTENT

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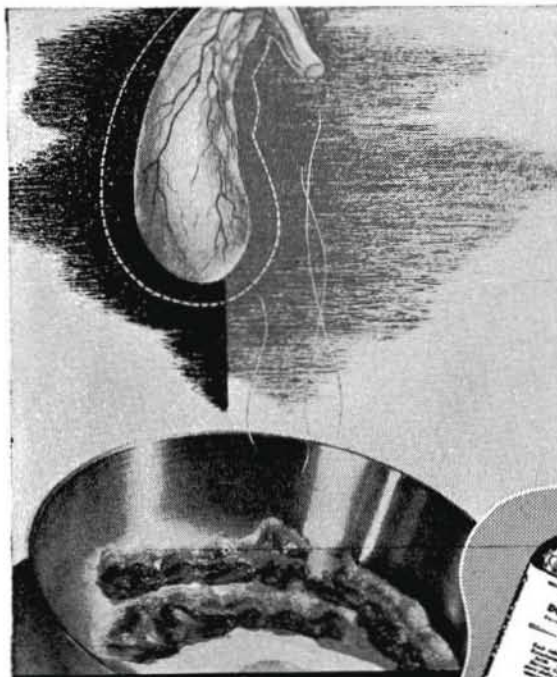
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
