# Prejudice-Free Study Points the Way to Greater Comfort for the Menopausal Patient 

Three groups of investigators were supplied with preparations labeled only by number. Although identical in appearance, the tablets had the following compositions:

AE-1-Diethylstilbestrol, 0.25 mg .
AE-2-Diethylstilbestrol, 0.25 mg. . plus methyltestosterone, 5 mg .
AE-3-Methyltestosterone, 5 mg .
AE-4-Placebo
Investigators were told which was the placebo, but identities of the first three were not disclosed until the studies and reports had been completed. Thus, there could be no possible bias on the part of either physician or patient.

Clinicians found that the addition of androgen to estrogen (1) often affords an increased feeling of well-being, (2) tends to avert mild but unpleasant side-effects such as breast turgidity and pelvic congestion, and (3) usually prevents the complication of uterine bleeding. Preference for AE-2 ('Tylosterone') was expressed by two-thirds of the patients.

## ELELTIIN UF IFFILERS SLHEDULLEI

Tulsa County Medical Society Sets Annual Business Meeting For December 8, 1952. Dues For Coming Year To Be Fixed By Membership.

Members of the Tulsa County Medical Society will meet Monday, December 8, 1952, in an annual business meeting and election of officers. Nineteen officials will be selected from a record list of 75 members eligible to hold office. Standing and special committees will render annual reports for the current year, and the membership will fix the amount of membership dues for 1953. The meeting will be at 8:00 P.M. at The Mayo. There will be no scientific program.

Officers to be elected include Presi-dent-Elect (to serve as President in 1954), Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, one member of the Board of Trustees, one member of the Board of Censors, three members of the House of Delegates, and eleven alternate delegates. Dr. John G. Matt, Tulsa proctologist elected last year, will assume office as President on January 1, 1953, succeeding Dr. Marshall O. Hart.

The incumbent Vice-President is Dr. W. D. Hoover, and the incumbent Sec-retary-Treasurer is Dr. Paul T. Strong.

Dr. Maurice J. Searle is the retiring member of the Board of Trustees. Holdover members include Dr. Robert E. Funk (1953), Dr. John E. McDonald (1954), Dr. Thomas J. Hardman (1955), and Dr. Ralph A. McGill (1956). Trustees serve five years each.

Dr. Thomas J. Hardman is the retiring member of the Board of Censors. Holdover members are Dr. J. D. Shipp (1953) and Dr. I. H. Nelson (1954). Censors serve a term of three years each.

There will be three vacancies on the

Dr. Philip Thorek of Chicago, who has spoken before Tulsa medical groups twice in the last two months, has in his recent book Anatomy in Surgery correlated the basic anatomy as taught to the beginning medical student and the regional anatomy which is the essential basis of operative surgical technique.

He has divided the book into ten sections, each representing a region of the body from the scalp to the feet and each is treated separately. Each region is subdivided into the basic anatomy followed by surgical lesions and procedures which illustrate the anatomical detail being considered.

One of the fine features of the book is the large collection of excellent drawings, over 700 in number, by one artist. Many of these are in color and all are of such size as to be easily readable. The author's clear and informal style insures its readability.

## DR. W. ALTON OCHSNER TO APPEAR AT 1953 CONVENTION

Three more nationally known medical personalities have been added to the list of visiting distinguished guest speakers for the 60th Annual Meeting of the Oklahoma State Medical Association in Tulsa, April 13-15, 1953, it was announced last month by Dr. Berget H. Blocksom, Program Chairman.

The new additions are:
Dr. W. Alton Ochsner, Professor and Head of the Department of Surgery, Tulane University School of Medicine, New Orleans, Louisiana.

Dr. Francis Braceland, Psychiatrist-InChief, The Institute of Living, internationally known psychiatric sanitarium and treatment center of Hartford, Connecticut.

Dr. Allan P. Bloxsom, formerly Professor and Head of the Department of Pediatrics, Baylor University, and now in private practice at Houston, Texas. Dr. Bloxsom won wide recognition for his development of a resussitation instrument for incubation of the so-called "blue babies".

This brings the total of guest speakers to nine. A list of those previously committed to appear may be found in the October issue of The Bulletin. An endocrinologist is yet to be selected.

CHARLES H. HARALSON, M.D. 1892-1952
Dr. Charles Herndon Haralson, 60, prominent Tulsa ophthalmologist and former President of the Tulsa County Medical Society, died at his Tulsa home on October 29, 1952, following an illness of four months.

A graduate of Emory University School of Medicine, Class of 1914, Dr. Haralson served with the United States Army Medical Corps during World War I, first as a medical officer at Camp Yaphank, New York, and later with the A.E.F. in France. Since coming to Tulsa in 1919 following his discharge from service he had specialized in Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology. In recent years his work was limited to the eye.

Dr. Haralson served as President of the Tulsa County Medical Society in 1933 and at various times had been a member of the Board of Trustees of the organization. He was a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons, Diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology, and a member of the American Academy of Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology. He was formerly Chief of Staff at St. John's Hospital.

Brown (1956), and Dr. J. D. Shipp (1956). Delegates serve a term of five years each. The Tulsa County Medical Society is entitled to a representation of eleven members.

Eleven alternates will also be selected for a one-year term. Those serving in 1952 were Dr. Earl M. Lusk, Dr. Thomas J. Hardman, Dr. Herbert S. Orr, Dr. I. H. Nelson, Dr. William A. Walker, Dr. Harold J. Black, Dr. L. A. Munding, Dr. Henry S. Browne, Dr. Thomas H. Davis, Dr. Clarence C. Hoke, and Dr. Emil E. Palik.

As provided by the By-Laws, a member must have (1) been a member of the Society for five full years, and (2) attended fifty per cent of the total number of regular meetings held during the current year in order to be eligible for nomination to office. A total of 75 who have attended four or more meetings are eligible for office in 1953. The list of eligibles appears in this issue of The Bulletin. Under regulations of the Board of Trustees, a member cannot receive credit for attendance unless his signature appears on the record book placed at the door at each meeting.
