Sending the presentation to you on Tuesday would be great! Thanks.

In general, posting handouts and slides should be fine, though we'll send you a separate version to post before your Archive launches. I'm not usually careful about copyright permissions for images when I use them in an academic talk, and its probably best if I strip any nonessential images from the slide before they get distributed on a public website. I usually do that for slide handouts anyway, as it makes the files smaller and easier to print.

Hi Mark,

If you know for sure that you will need to revise, I recommend waiting to send the presentation to me until Tuesday of next week. That will be easier than loading it the day of the conference. Will that work?

The presentation will play on a new MacBook Pro. A "pptx" file should be great.

We will be archiving Interdisciplinary Moral Forum presentation materials in our [Moral Self Archive](#), which will be launched one or two weeks *after* the IMF. The archive will be freely accessible to all moral self researchers and to the general public. It will not be password protected.

Here's how our permissions process works.

- **Proposal title, author information and abstract** – This already appears on [our website](#) and will also appear in the IMF program. So no special permission is needed before putting this information in the archive.
- **Audience handouts, slides, and any materials meant only for reviewers** – These will appear in the archive *only* if the PI gives explicit written permission. We prefer to post these materials when the archive first launches. If requested, however, we can postpone archiving the materials until *after* final award decisions have been made.
- **Video of the presentation** – Presentation videos are a standard part of Templeton-funded projects. One of Susan Berntson's recent emails included a note saying participants will be expected to sign a photo/video permissions form. This will be a 1-2 line statement giving permission to the SMV Project to use for (non-profit) promotional purposes images and footage that may include your likeness, and to post the video of your presentation on the Moral Self Archive.

With this in view, are you comfortable agreeing to the following statement?

I give full permission to the SMV Project to include the 2015 Interdisciplinary Moral Forum (IMF) presentation ("Investigating Implicit Aspects of Virtue") handouts and slides in the Moral Self Archive. I understand that the Moral Self Archive will be accessible soon after the IMF is complete.
