Mr. DANIEL submitted the following

RESOLUTION:

*Resolved*, That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, directed to inform the Senate what amounts will be due the States of New York, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Virginia, and South Carolina, and the city of Baltimore on account of advances and expenditures made by them in the war of 1812, computing the interest on said advances and expenditures as set forth in the amendment intended to be proposed by Mr. Butler, of South Carolina, to bill H. R. 10726, making appropriations for the current and contingent expenses of the Indian department, and for fulfilling treaty stipulations with various Indian tribes for the year ending June 30, 1891, and for other purposes, as offered by him June 21, 1890. The Secretary of the Treasury is also requested to state what debts and obligations are due, if any, from the respective States and the city of Baltimore to the United States.

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
